Teaching-learning strategies address the transition to the professional nursing role and the changing dynamics in health care that could challenge new nurses as they enter a full practice role for the first time. Students will review key elements of management and leadership theory and roles and will examine strategies and processes that address professionalism; morale and governance; improvement of care delivery; facilitation of change; quality and safety principles; technology and health data management; evidence-based practice; clinical judgment and decision making. Students in the clinical course will apply the principles of they have learned throughout the curriculum.

Prerequisites: All previous NRSE courses. Must be taken in the final term.
